





### PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Code 1988 §2-348. (Duties). The parks and recreation advisory board shall review all business and operations of the several parks and recreation areas and the recreation programs of the city; shall investigate any problems relating thereto; shall receive, review and present community recommendations; and shall ensure that the city council is fully apprised of parks and recreation matters at all times.

- Limited in size (Less than an acre)
- Limited recreational use
- Serves commercial districts or neighborhood



- Contain 10 acres or less
- Has facilities associated with playgrounds, sports courts, un-programmed sports fields.
- Serves adjacent residential neighborhoods





- Generally greater than 10 acres
- Recreation is programmed and may include sports field complexes and swimming pools.
- Facilities may also include opportunities for passive recreation (walking trails, nature viewing, wildlife viewing, etc.)
- Intended to serve a district or group of neighborhoods



- Typically more than 50 acres
- Includes recreation associated with large sports complexes, exposition centers, camping, hiking, fishing, etc.
- Draws people in from outside the community that have specific intent to visit the park.



- No specific size requirement associated with this park type
- Designated for single purpose recreational activities such as golf courses, aquatic centers, shooting ranges, etc.
- Depending on use may serve neighborhoods, the entire community, or be a regional draw.





- Active recreational use
- Greenbelts, scenic parks, parkways, etc.
- Reserves or natural areas.
- Road rights-of-way/drainage channels



- Greenbelts, scenic parks, parkways, etc.
- Sensitive environmental areas.
- Reserves or natural areas.
- Habitat restoration or fallow land.
- Stand-alone or portion of a park.





- Include Public Squares, Greens, Plazas, etc.
- Gathering spaces for community activities including concerts, farmer's markets, and open air entertainment
- Spaces all areas of the community can come together and participate in activities


